

NARRATIVE REPORT

Accomplishment Report for 2010

After seven (7) years of relentless effort of POSO in its drive to preserve peace and order in the City of Alaminos, has successfully gained momentum in achieving its goal and is winning the fight in the most important areas.

In illegal drugs, from Nineteen (19) cases of apprehended drug pushers in 2007, it went down to Three (3) cases in 2008, Two (2) cases in 2009 and Four (4) cases of drug peddling have been recorded on 2010.

With regards to Jueteng and other illegal gambling activities, in the year 2007, Fifteen (15) cases was recorded, and it gradually declined to Eight (8) cases in 2008 and Two (2) cases in 2009, and down only Zero (0) cases in 2010.

In minor cases, except for traffic violations and illegal fishing, violations in all other areas have declined.

In Market Enforcement, daily monitoring at the market was consistently carried out to prevent the occurrence of bag slashing/pickpocketing/snatching/bodol-bodol and ambulant vendors from plying their trade at the sidewalks which is in violation of City Ord. 2003-23, likewise they prevented store/stall and building illegal structures. POSO Market Enforcers also periodically checked weighing scales, conducted market denial to suspected dynamited fish and in coordination with CAO City Vet, and Market Administration, kept a close watch on meat/ meat products sold at Suki Market and Nepo Mart to protect the interest of consumers/buying public and prevent the spread of diseases and accidental poisoning. As of 2010, Fifty Nine (59) ambulant vendors were brought to POSO and then released after they were given stern warning. POSO has also assisted the City Treasurer's Office and Market Supervisor in confiscating tampered/ unsealed/ unregistered weighing scales that resulted to the confiscation of Two (2) weighing scales. POSO have given assistance to with City Vet. employees in the apprehension of Nine (9) persons who violated the Anti-Hot Meat Ordinance (City Ord. 2003-31) and were brought to this office for proper documentation. After confiscating their meat products, they were given a final warning.

POSO does its share in the effort of the City government to increase tax collection by providing assistance to Business Licensing in checking Mayor's/Business Permits of all the business establishments, franchise of Public Motorized Tricycle and Annual Fixed Tax, likewise conducts operations at Videoke Bars and twenty Nine (29) had no Mayor's Permit.

For the welfare of minors and to eradicate/minimize vices and other forms of social ills, an intense monitoring was made by POSO Night Patrols during night-time and POSO Beat Patrols during day-time. Zero (0) minors were caught in the middle of the night roaming around and Twenty Four (24) minor students was also found cutting classes playing computer games during school hours who were

minor in their establishments.

POSO Bantay Dagat and PNP Alaminos City were frontiers in the apprehension of Fishery and Environmental Laws in coordination with CAO and DENR. A keen monitoring and roving within the sea waters of Hundred Island National Park were conducted daily for the preservation of natural resources. However, despite a close watch of our POSO/PNP Bantay Dagat in the sea waters of our city, cases of illegal fishing decreased One Hundred Fifty (150) on 2009 to Eighty Eight (88) persons most of which are from neighboring towns. These apprehended illegal fishermen paid the corresponding penalties and were released by the court. This is a clear indication that the recent Global Crisis and several calamities that hit the country is a contributing factor to the commission of these illegal activities.

In Traffic Enforcement Program, POSO has been implementing the City Ord. 2005-22 known as "Comprehensive Traffic Ordinance" for two years now. POSO Traffic Enforcers manned the streets especially in Central Business District to maintain the smooth flow of traffic so as not to delay business dealings and prevent occurrence of traffic accidents that will eventually result to damage of property and loss of human life. For the whole year, we have apprehended Seven Hundred Eighty Eight (788) traffic/pedestrian violators and Six Hundred Eighty Five (685) redeemed and paid their penalties at Treasurer's Office while Sixty Three (63) violator's were charged at Prosecutor's Office for noncompliance. There was also a strict apprehension on the Colorum/unregistered vehicles resulting on the apprehension of Fifty Eight (58) of all the total of violators and Forty One (41) redeemed and paid their penalties at Treasurer's Office while the rest were charged at the Prosecutor's Office for non-compliance. After payment of their corresponding penalties, Thirty One (31) cases were dismissed by the court.

As a whole, it is safe to conclude that our effort has not turned in vain and we are gradually achieving the goal of our City Government that is to provide our people a safe and harmonious place to live in.
